Salt Museum, Northwich

Macclesfield

This was an international centre for silk manufacture, and the story is told in the Silk Museum within the Heritage Centre, Paradise Mill Museum. West Park Museum is set in one of the earliest public parks and covers art, ancient Egyptian artefacts and local history, and the ancient market town also has a vibrant, modern shopping centre.

Knutsford

The Danish King Canute forded the River Lily in 1016, hence the name Knutsford (Canute's Ford). The annual RHS Flower Show is held in Tatton Park, a thousand-acre parkland with herds of red and fallow deer and two historic houses. The Georgian mansion Tatton Hall has paintings by Italian and Dutch masters among its collections as well as wonderful gardens. Old Hall dates from the Tudor period and has Home Farm alongside, a working farm unchanged since the 1930s. King Street is, in a word, charming. This narrow little thoroughfare is packed with cafés, shops and restaurants.

Delamere

Delamere Forest Park is Cheshire's largest area of woodland and ideal for countryside and wildlife. There's lots to do with bike hire, a café, picnic sites, viewing points, a shop, visitor centre and the opportunity to Go Ape! – a high-wire adventure course of rope bridges, swings and zip slides up to 35ft off the ground.

Warrington

You can travel through time and around the world at the family-friendly Warrington Museum and Art Gallery, with hands-on activities, collections ranging from coins and medals to local history, archaeology and natural history as well as a changing programme of exhibitions. Great places for big names are the Golden Square Shopping Centre and Cockhedge Shopping Park.

Whitchurch

Founded by the Romans, this is the oldest continually inhabited settlement in Shropshire. Famous for producing Cheshire cheese, it is also home to the world's oldest clock makers, and the full story is told in the Heritage Centre. There are interesting Town Trails to take, and five walks from Jubilee Park include the Sandstone Trail with the staircase locks of the Llangollen Canal just a mile or so outside town.

Time restrictions

Cheshire Day Ranger tickets are available for travel on trains timed to depart from 0845 Mondays to Fridays and any time weekends and Bank Holidays.

Where to purchase

Cheshire Day Ranger tickets can be bought at any staffed station or from conductors on trains when starting your journey from unstaffed stations or when the ticket office is closed. Prices and conditions valid until 31 December 2010.
