Time restrictions

North West Round Robin tickets are available for travel on trains timed to depart from 0845 Mondays to Fridays and any time weekends and Bank Holidays.

Where to purchase

North West Round Robin tickets can be bought at any staffed station or from conductors on trains when starting your journey from unstaffed stations or when the ticket office is closed. Prices and conditions valid until 31 December 2010.

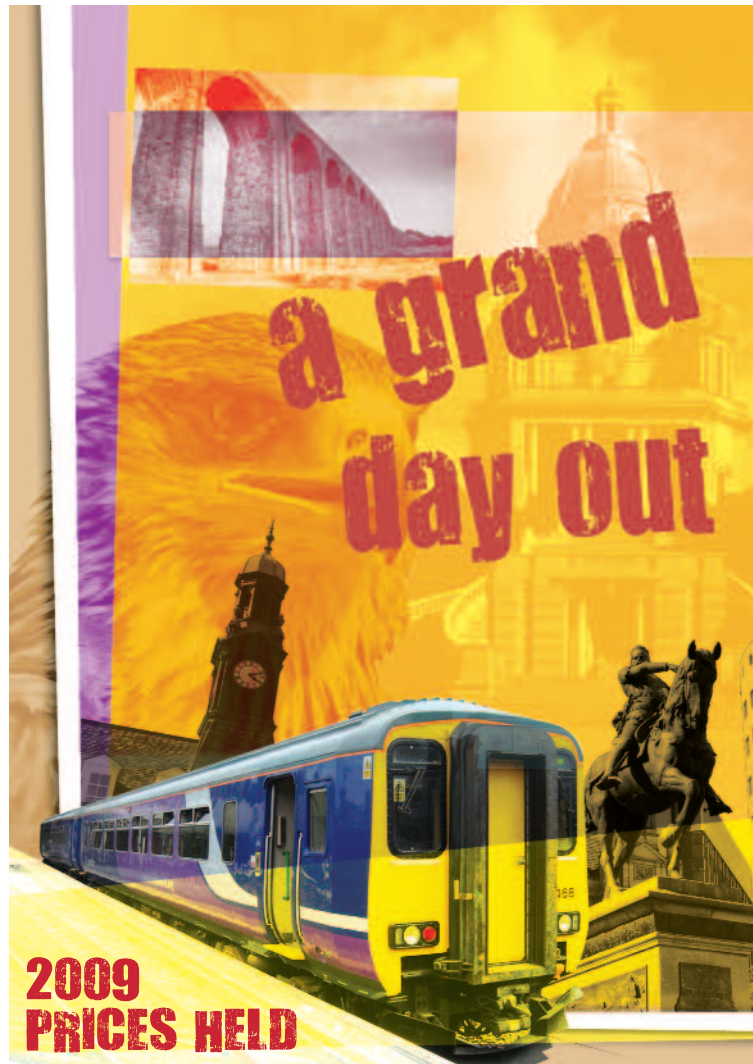

Settle

Crossing the incredible 24-arch Ribbleshead Viaduct, possibly the most famous landmark in rail travel, the train journey between Settle and Carlisle offers incredible views. In the pretty market town of Settle, the historic Shambles overlooking the Market Place (once a medieval butchers and slaughterhouse) has shopping on two levels. The Museum of North Craven Life, with its rolling programme of exhibitions, is housed in the 1679-built Folly.

Carlisle – The Great Border City

Carlisle Castle watched over the city for nine centuries, and even more haunting than its chambers, stairways and dungeons is the story of prisoners who sipped moisture from the 'licking stones' to survive – until going to Gallows Hill. The Castle now houses the Border Regiment Museum. The city's splendid cathedral has ornate carvings and its Citadel was also once a prison. Exhibits and displays at Tullie House Museum and Art Gallery range from wildlife and geology to Pre-Raphaelite art, while shopping in Carlisle never fails to impress with Cumbria's premier centre, The Lanes.

Blackburn

Blackburn boasts the North West's largest market with over 400 stalls and Lancashire's largest Anglican Cathedral, where you can see an impressive collection of modern art. Blackburn Museum and Art Gallery is noted for the Hart bequest, a remarkable treasure trove ranging from art and coins to an Egyptian mummy, and also houses the collection of the former Lewis Textile Museum. And there's no shortage of textiles in the town's mill shops.

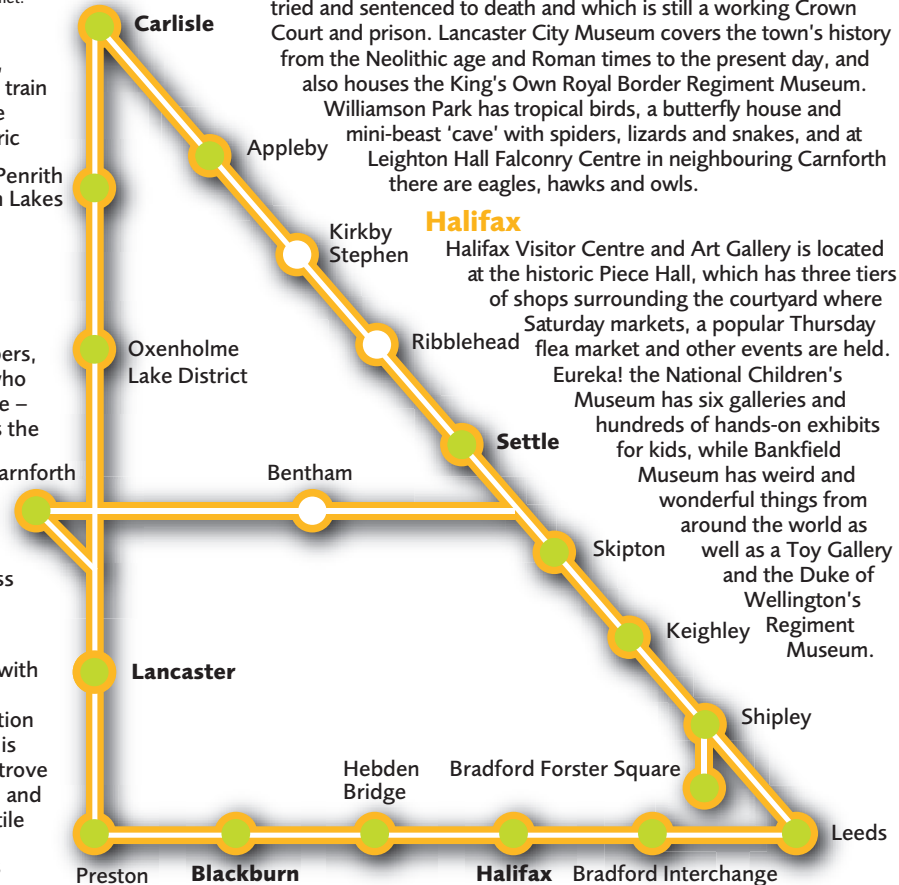

Lancaster

Spend time in Lancaster Castle where the Pendle Witches were tried and sentenced to death and which is still a working Crown Court and prison. Lancaster City Museum covers the town's history from the Neolithic age and Roman times to the present day, and also houses the King's Own Royal Border Regiment Museum. Williamson Park has tropical birds, a butterfly house and mini-beast 'cave' with spiders, lizards and snakes, and at Leighton Hall Falconry Centre in neighbouring Carnforth there are eagles, hawks and owls.

Halifax

Halifax Visitor Centre and Art Gallery is located at the historic Piece Hall, which has three tiers of shops surrounding the courtyard where Saturday markets, a popular Thursday flea market and other events are held. Eureka! the National Children's Museum has six galleries and hundreds of hands-on exhibits for kids, while Bankfield Museum has weird and wonderful things from around the world as well as a Toy Gallery and the Duke of Wellington's Regiment Museum.
